### **Eastminster Book Club**

Have you ever been a part of a book club? Well I am extending an invitation to you to join the Eastminster Book Club which will get into full swing this coming August. The good news is we are going to be reading a book which is very familiar to you, and although it is a book of epic proportions, you will have plenty of opportunity to finish it. You can also invite friends and family members to join you.

The Club will last for 31 weeks and the book is entitled *The Story*. *The Story* is a best-selling abridged chronological Bible. There are no verse references in the text, and the segments of Scripture are woven together, with transition text written to connect the storyline so it reads like a seamless story. For people new to the Bible, this way of reading Scripture reduces the intimidation one can feel when approaching the full-length unabridged Bible, and it gives them a holistic and sequential picture of the storyline of Scripture.

For seasoned Bible veterans the chronological arrangement of the essential texts reveals the way the whole Bible fits together in a single grand narrative. Reading through *The Story* triggers interest and understanding, and drives people back to the original Bible texts for further exploration.

Over the coming month you will hear more about the book and how we will integrate the study of *The Story* into the life of the church. First of all, I will be preaching through the 31 weeks it takes to complete the book, so as we progress, my sermons will be centered on the text of the week. This will give us all the opportunity to have what we read reinforced by what we hear. There will be other opportunities too. There is a website which you can access for more information and resources which will enhance our study, and without the standard points of reference and biblical structures, readers of *The Story* are far more likely to experience new discoveries within familiar passages. This is a key purpose of the book.

This book tells the grandest, most compelling story of all times: the story of a true God who loves his children, who established for them a way of salvation and provided a route to eternity. It is a story the world needs to hear and gives us here at Eastminster an opportunity to invite others to join us for the 31 weeks. What an easy way to do what God has asked each of us to do: declare the good news here, there, and everywhere.

I am excited about exploring the story with you and with those you choose to have join us.

### **Christian Education**

**Vacation Bible School** was enjoyed by 23 children and 13 adults during the week of June 4-8. The Summer Camp Program did not join us at the last minute because it was their first week with a number of new participants who needed to learn the routine of their schedule. Of the 23 children, more than half were visitors so it was a very good outreach for the week.

**Next year's VBS is set for July 8-12** so that coordination with the Summer Camp Program can happen. The tentative theme is "Where in the World is Fred?" (Fred is the Norwegian word for Peace.) We will look at peace in our hearts, our home, our school, our neighborhood and our world.

#### **Sunday School:**

**July 15-August 12:** The Summer schedule will continue with two adult classes meeting from 9:45-10:45. The class in the Adult Center, ably taught by Sally Jackson and Marty Hillman, is using **The Mighty Acts of God** by Arnold Rhodes. The other class is in Founders Hall and is using the NOOMA videos created by Rob Bell, a noted pastor, writer and speaker. Discussion is led by a different class member each week. Children and Youth classes will resume the middle of August.

**Beginning August 19:** The Story. (See Caleb's message) This is a 31 week program that presents the overarching story of the Bible. We will begin on Aug. 26, take a break for the month of December for an Advent study, then pick it back up in January and run until the last Sunday of April. This allows the program to have the lesson about the resurrection on Easter Sunday next year. This then will be the focus of worship, Sunday school and some of the Wednesday night programs for September through April.

Rally Day is set for August 19, the first Sunday after both Gwinnett and Dekalb County school systems are in session. The program will be introduced that day with Aug. 26 to be the first Sunday for the curriculum **The Story** to begin.

# Excerpts from minutes of the Stated Meeting on June 24, 2012

Sarah Baldwin, Pre-School director, will be working this summer as our communication intern to coordinate the efforts as a new EPC website is being developed and launched later this year.

Building and Grounds - All thermostats will be replaced with digital programmable units and will be locked. Thermostats will be programmed for regularly scheduled meetings and events. If a meeting is scheduled that is not on the calendar, it will be that group's responsibility to call the office so that the thermostat controlling that particular room/area can be adjusted.

Outreach – School supply collection starts in July for the two co-ops. A list of school supplies will be printed in Witness and bulletin.

A one day project is to be scheduled for sometime in August for all interested EPC members to volunteer with Charis Community Housing.

In Touch – Health Fair at EPC is planned for Saturday, October 20 and the Blood Drive on Sunday, October 21.

Church wide picnic tentatively scheduled for August is being re-evaluated due to concerns of excessive heat.

Ways and Means - Budget for June had a shortfall of \$6,063.58 with the YTD deficit of \$18,908.10.

Committee will be meeting to discuss current budget shortfall and begin discussions for the 2013 budget.

Senior Adult Ministry - On going events are scheduled for the summer including a tour of the Temple on Peachtree.



Our journey will be introduced on August 19 during the Sunday School Kickoff.


