"Ride in on a Donkey"

My first day at Eastminster Presbyterian Preschool, I sat in the quiet office of the Director with a stack of binders in front of me: "Registration 2012-2013", "Immunization Forms", "School Year 2011-2012", and a blue, one-inch binder with no label. The blue binder had been passed along to me just days before by Jennifer Neu, the previous Preschool Director. Page one: "Duties of the Director." I sat there reading through the list. One page turned into two, and the tally of duties had reached fifty. "I can do this," I thought to myself.

I tried to imagine what the students and teachers would be like, and what my day would be like when school was back in session after Spring Break. I had a rapid-fire introduction to so many people in the loving Eastminster community, but the people I would be working with every day, I had yet to meet. That first quiet week, I went through binders and folders, read handbooks, looked at the list of events for the rest of the year, and tried to wrap my head around what Eastminster Presbyterian Preschool was all about. It became clear: this preschool is a legacy. Since 1968, directors, teachers, children, and church members have poured their energy and hearts into creating a caring, safe, and nurturing school. And from this realization, I began to compile a vision of who I wanted to be for this school, for this community, and for the children. While there is a solid foundation that decades of dedication have created, I can see the areas that need a fresh coat of paint.

My first Sunday at Eastminster was Palm Sunday. I sat in the Sanctuary for the first time. As Mardee Rightmyer invited the young children to come forward to the front of the church, Beverly Hutchinson sat to my right, leaned over and whispered, "The second one on the left, that's Bella Acosta, she's one of your preschoolers". There sat little Bella, a smile on her face and ribbon in her hair, sporting the Sunday Church dress of a budding Southern belle. I couldn't help but smile; the kids were a part of this job I knew I would love. "Does anyone know why Jesus rode in on a donkey and not a horse?" asked Mardee. The children looked left and right at each other until one little boy answered, "Because they didn't have horses back then." "Precious," I thought to myself with a smirk.

As Mardee continued her sermon to the children, she explained that the donkey was an animal of peace and sign of humility; Jesus chose this animal to show the people of Jerusalem what kind of King he was. Jesus was there to bring peace to the people of Jerusalem, not to wage war. He was there to bring the change and hope His people so desperately needed.

As Christians, we look to Jesus as the example of how we should live our lives. "Ride in on a donkey," I reminded myself as I drove to Eastminster that Monday morning after Spring Break. From the moment the first car door was opened at carpool, I knew I was where I was needed. It is with humility and hope for the future that I take on this position as Director of the Preschool. Thank you for opening your arms to welcome me. I feel incredibly blessed with this opportunity to be a part of the Eastminster Presbyterian Preschool legacy you have all worked to create.
