#### Summer Worship will be COOL, CASUAL CHURCH...at 10 A.M

Keeping the Now AND Reclaiming the Past ... in a New Way

Summer Interactive Vespers...at 7 P.M.

Many of us over fifty years of age remember Sunday evening vespers; going to church twice on Sunday was just a given for folks in the south. Many under fifty probably respond with a perplexed look and ask "What are "Vespers?" Well, vespers specifically refers to an evening service of prayers in the Roman Catholic and Anglican (Episcopal) churches. Other denominations picked up the term to refer to a Sunday evening service that was less formal than the morning service and often included more singing and praying.

The Christian Education committee is reviving vespers ... with a new twist. "Sunday school" is moving from morning to the evening for the three months of summer. Vespers will start at 7:00 p.m. with singing and prayers, then instead of a sermon there will be an interactive Bible lesson. (Adults don't worry! Your interaction can be as simple as reflecting on the questions, if that is your level of comfort!) After the lesson, we will have social time – with the refreshments coordinating with the theme of the service! This will be for all ages! If you go away for the weekend don't bother to change into "churchy clothes" – just come as you are! And we promise to have you home before dark!

But for the summer it is the season to bring someone to church!

EXCERPTS FROM MINUTES OF MARCH 17, 2013 SESSION MEETING

General information for Session and congregation - Monthly calendar and scheduling of events. As part of the communications project, EPC is changing how events are to be scheduled on the calendar. Going forward all requests for activities, events, meetings, etc. will go thru Paula. There will be a form to complete and she will update the master calendar which will be available on the website and a copy outside the church office on the bulletin board.

Worship committee recommended for approval going to one Sunday service from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Session approved recommendation from committee with the time to be determined.

Weekday Ministries – Our pre-school and afterschool programs currently have 133 children enrolled. The directors' goals are to increase enrollment for both programs to a total of 150 children. Plans are underway for the summer camp afterschool program.

Ways and Means – Budget continues to be in black –for month of February \$17,251.95.

Congregational Life committee and In-touch committee will be combined to form Congregational Life and Care. Committee will include involvement and members representing the deacons, OASIS/Sr. Adult and Stephen Ministry.

Music Search Committee is working diligently in search for EPC music director.
