Advent

It is hard to believe, but November is here and before we know it Thanksgiving will be just another memory for the year 2012. But the good news is that there is good news in the coming of Christ and we look forward to the Advent Season. Advent is the beginning of the Church Year for most churches in the Western tradition. It begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve (December 24).

The word **Advent** means "coming" or "arrival". The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Thus, Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000 year old event in history. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ whereby all of creation might be reconciled to God. That is a process in which we now participate, and the consummation of which we anticipate. Scripture reading for Advent will reflect this emphasis on the Second Advent, including themes of accountability for faithfulness at His coming, judgment on sin, and the hope of eternal life.

In this double focus on past and future, Advent also symbolizes the spiritual journey of individuals and a congregation, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power. Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing. There is a yearning for deliverance from the evils of the world, first expressed by Israelite slaves in Egypt as they cried out from their bitter oppression. It is the cry of those who have experienced the tyranny of injustice in a world under the curse of sin, and yet who have hope of deliverance by a God who has heard the cries of oppressed slaves and brought deliverance!

It is with that hope which we enter this holiday season, and we can look forward to a compilation of Advent Devotionals prepared by members of Eastminster. These devotionals will be recorded on a CD and will be offered to each and every member of EPC. These recordings will reflect on the subject of the Sunday sermons to be given during December leading up to Christmas. We will be taking a break from our journey through *The Story* as we explore four questions which Jesus asked his disciples and four questions which are still relevant for us today. These questions come out of Mark's Gospel and are:

"How many loaves do you have?" (Mark 6:30-44)

"Who do you say that I am?" (Mark 8:27-30)

"Why are you so afraid?" (Mark 4:35-41)

"What do you want me to do for you?" (Mark 10:46-52)

Our hope is that this devotional CD and Sermon series will be a great joy to you and your family as we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Christ Child.


