The Roof is Fixed

As most of you know, the church now has a new watertight roof. We must first thank God for leading us through a successful and safe project and for the wonderful weather provided, most of the time. Then there was the planning and oversight of the Building and Grounds committee, assistance from various volunteers in the congregation and the professional work of Findlay Roofing Company that resulted in the entire project being completed on schedule and under budget. Also appreciated are the heroic efforts of the church staff and school program leaders for accommodating the various interruptions to access, above normal noise and unique acrobatics on the roofs. The anticipated interruptions to building access from the north and south parking lots were accepted and handled by everyone in a professional manner.

We must admit the work did have its minor complications. We regret there was a surprise at the amount of debris entering Founders Hall and the sanctuary. Luckily, we discovered the concern in Founders Hall and were much more prepared by the time we reached the sanctuary. Interior clean-up was quickly performed by the church maintenance staff. We also had one incident where a decision to cut a replacement piece of roof decking resulted in a surprise cut to an air conditioner refrigerant line. The Findlay crew had the repair quickly and efficiently repaired (on a weekend) without any impact to church services on Sunday.

Our inspection team, consisting of Mark Hartle and John Hinkle, were present to ensure that the job was being performed correctly on a daily basis. They did discover some installation issues, discussed these issues with the Findlay supervisor and had them corrected as the job progressed. At one point in the project, a concern was raised about the basic correctness of the installation process. B&G personnel investigated the quality of the installation, adherence to manufacturer's design and installation procedures and the applicability of specific building codes to the process. Findlay personnel presented our concerns to the Owens Corning manufacturer of the shingles who assured us that they will fully warrant the roof as installed by Findlay.

Considering that approximately 50% of the shingle replacement was performed on roof sections with a pitch of 87.5 degrees, by workers swinging from ropes and harnesses, safety precautions, planned and executed, ensured that there were no injuries. Overall the professionalism and attention to detail of the Findlay installation crew and supervision was excellent and is applauded by those who worked them.

The new Owens Corning TruDefinition Duration Shingles now installed are superior to the old shingles in every category. The shingles have a completely new design, are manufactured using longer lasting combination of materials, have a lamination design that will not separate, will withstand up to 130 mph winds and are warranted for 40 years. The work scope and materials consisted of 36,500 square feet of surface recovered, more than 14,000 shingles, 84,000 nails, 38 pipe roof penetration boot seals,365 rolls of fiberglass reinforced roof felt and 200 rolls of Weatherlock Ice and Water Shield. The newly installed flashing has a super hard powder coat painted finish. In addition, approximately 500 square feet of bad wood was replaced.

Finally, everyone will be interested to know the roof project estimated at \$125,000 to complete came to a final bill of \$110,000. In the grand scheme of things, I believe that in addition to the recent Easter celebration of Jesus and the Resurrection, maybe God gave EPC a little bonus for our struggles.
