Capital Campaign Update

It has been a very exciting time here at EPC as we see the way God is moving us toward a very successful Capital Campaign. So I want to take this issue of the Witness to bring you up to date on where we are in the process. I also want to explain how we are going to handle the decision making process from this point forward.

First of all I want to tell you that this campaign, although filled with meetings and notices and updates, has been a campaign which above all else has sought God's guidance in all things. Now that we are at the point of discerning the best approach to its completion, we need God's guidance as much now as ever. So the Steering Committee will be considering the pledge amounts, the expected receipts of those amounts and the timing of payments of the individual elements of the campaign. In that this is a three year campaign, it will take discernment and wisdom to decide the appropriate use of funds over the next 36 months. It is to God that we look for such wisdom.

The Steering Committee will develop a plan for those items and the approximate time for their completion and they will make recommendations to session for the final approval. To date we have received 96 pledges totaling \$437,000; also, over \$90,000 of that has already been given. The congregation has responded to God's leading and I believe properly handled, these funds will supply our every need.

The committee will need to consider the urgency and expense of each item and develop a plan that can maximize the use of funds and at the same time facilitate the completion of the projects as soon as possible. The good news is that as we obtain competitive bids we are finding that many of the projects are coming in way under what we budgeted. This means that although we have not raised all we wished for, God is providing all that we actually need.

We are even now considering various options for the timing and expenditure of the funds we have received. These options take into consideration the urgency for security and need for signage and the retirement of the roof loan, along with the remaining. These options are all good and we look forward to discerning what God is saying about the "BEST' way forward. Further news is that there are additional funds that have been accumulating for the roof repair/loan retirement outside of the campaign funds which we can also utilize.

There have been expenses of the campaign and there will be more. There is a reserve for the possibility of unpaid pledges and we are allocating 10% of receipts for exciting and new mission activities. So, all of us need to continue in prayer that God: "Open hearts and minds to receive God's Spirit." It will be through God's inspiration that we have the wisdom to complete this campaign. In 1 Corinthians Paul urged the Church in Corinth to not rely on the wisdom of humans because it is sometimes foolishness to God; we need God's wisdom as it is revealed to the body here at Eastminster.




Capital Campaign Celebration "Sundaes on Sunday"
