Update on ESL Tutoring

It has been over a year since a dedicated group of Eastminster members and friends took training at the Literacy Volunteers of Atlanta and prepared to provide ESL (English as a Second Language) tutoring to a group of Mizo men from Burma (Myanmar). Thanks to donations from the congregation "Side By Side" books were purchased and provided to the students. Contact with Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church provided us access to their facility and tutoring has been held every Monday and Thursday evening at 7:30-9:00 p.m.

When we learned that 6 men were eligible to apply for US citizenship, Alice Day made plans to hold civics class on Thursday evening. Alice and Linda Redman found materials and lessons on the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration website and reproduced learning materials and questions for the men. Si Zova received a date for his interview appointment and took his exam in August. He was successful in passing and will become a US citizen. His fellow students surrounded him with congratulations.

Becoming a citizen is a long process, and it requires a five year residency period before one becomes eligible. The application fee is expensive, and the other men have decided to wait until 2015 before applying.

Alice continues to tutor 2 men who have interview dates in 2014. The focus of the Thursday tutoring will be on conversational English with time spent on use of verbs, developing comfort level in speaking in sentences and expanding vocabulary for everyday conversations.

The men are very faithful in their attendance, and are eager to learn. This is a very special community outreach that benefits the volunteers as well.
