AREYOU READY?

So, how do you get ready for Christmas? Are you like some people who start planning as early as January? Do you start buying presents and ornaments when they are on sale hoping you won't get in the frantic shopping season? Or, maybe you are the exact opposite and wait until the day before and pack it all in at once. No matter how you prepare you probably have figured out what works for you and that simply becomes your way of getting ready.

But that is Christmas. That is when we knock ourselves out trying to spend more money than we have, eating more junk food than we should and rushing around to accomplish more than we need. Christmas is about trees and wreaths and lights and all those other things that our culture pushes and our traditions demand. It is a tiring, hectic time but we look forward to it each year with all sorts of hope and expectations. But what about Jesus, do we get ready for Him?

The Western Christian churches observe a time of getting ready for the coming of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas and we call it ADVENT. That word 'advent' comes from the Latin word *adventus* which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia*. Parousia means a coming and in the New Testament refers to the Second Coming of Christ. So in our experience we get ready for the coming of Christ from two different perspectives: one is the Nativity and the other is when He will <u>come again</u>.

Here at Eastminster we begin preparing for the Nativity of Jesus on the last Sunday of November and we will have different and exciting opportunities to ready ourselves. Our Advent schedule describes the weekly Sunday evening events and I would encourage you to attend each and every one. We will also combine our worship services at the 11 O'clock service so we can all worship together. During these worship times we will explore the Greatest Gift we get at Christmas: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace. We will then all gather for our special 5:30 worship on Christmas Eve.

This year let's set our hearts and minds on preparing for the nativity of Jesus with as much resolve as we prepare for our cultural Christmas. But there is that other perspective which we can easily overlook: that is His Second Coming. How do we prepare and ready ourselves for that event? To help us answer that, we will take the next three Sundays to see what the Book of Matthew has to say. It is all nestled in the 25th Chapter of Matthew (why not read it?). Jesus uses parables to tell his disciples about the planning and preparation for that time when Jesus will come again.

So ready yourself for Christmas as it is just around the corner; but remember that in the midst of all those gifts is a most precious one. It is the gift of Jesus who came and the one who died that you and I might live. And one more thing, be alert, for He is coming again!
