Jeanne will complete the process for ordination and we can look forward to her ordination service sometime in the early spring.

Your session approved the funding of a new Older Adult Ministry here at EPC for the coming year and we all look forward to Jeanne coming on board to lead this ministry into what I know will be a great future. Many folks have worked hard over the last few years to make this a reality and I know that there are many more of you who will want to help Jeanne and others make this ministry a success for both EPC and our older adult community. You will be hearing more about this ministry in the weeks to come.

Give Al Stacer a BIG thank you for his work over the last year. With seminary taking so much of his time, Jeanne's arrival is nothing short of God's Hand at work. Give Jeanne a BIG congratulations for her accomplishments and passion for this ministry and give yourself a BIG pat on the back for all the good things that are to come.

<u>UPDATE</u>: We have just completed our Stewardship Campaign and although the pledges are not all in, we are pleased with the results so far. As of today we have 67 pledges toward our goal for 2015 which represents about 60% of our pledging units. Of those already pledging we have folks pledging for the first time and others who have increased their pledges to help with the ministries in the coming year.

There are many folks who wait until the very last to turn their pledges in, so for them I say: "It is the very end!". So if you have not pledged, please do so as soon as possible. We need to begin planning for the next year and your pledges guide us through that process. But, thanks to each of you for your generous response to the campaign and just remember how much God desires that we be a cheerful giver.

<u>UPDATE</u>: As we close out the first year of the Capital Campaign we are so blessed to have had so many members, and former members, participate in the effort to bring our facilities back into 'ship shape' condition. Of the pledges for the three years, we already have received almost \$140,000.00. With that we have begun repayment of the roof loan, installed our new security system and ordered our new sign (which seems to be on a slow boat from China).

The Committee will meet again in the New Year to consider the use of the funds for the year 2015 and make plans for 2016.

<u>UPDATE:</u> As we make our way to Christmas, may our journey be marked by love. As God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son, may we show such love to a world in such great need!

# **Current Events Discussion Group**

Have you ever wanted to be able to discuss current events in a way that you hear all "sides" in a respectful way that allows you to expand your understanding of complex issues? If so, we have a new group for you! Beginning in January, Bill Chittick, (our own church member best known here as Joyce's quiet husband) has agreed to moderate a discussion group about current events. Bill is so modest that you probably don't know that he has a life as Dr. William O. Chittick, emeritus professor of political science at the University of Georgia. He has written books and articles about American foreign policy, public opinion, and the press. He taught courses in American foreign policy, international relations, and global policy analysis. He is former President of the International Studies Association/South and former Head of the Public Opinion and Foreign Policy Section (now Foreign Policy Analysis Section) of the American Political Science Association. Just a few months ago, Dr. Chittick presented a paper at an international conference held in Switzerland.

Dr. Chittick is also a believer in the <u>Schwartz Theory of Basic Values</u> developed by Dr. Shalom Schwartz a social psychologist at Hebrew University of Jerusalem. This theory will be the basis for our respectful discussion group. Since this theory is not one known to most of us, Dr. Chittick will present the basics of the theory for the Wednesday night program on January 14. What better place to begin this type of discussion group. If you have any questions, please talk to Bill or to Mardee, who are both excited about this new adventure for thoughtful encounters to grow in our life together.

#### **Mackie Wilmer**


